Written Assignment:

- I. Please write down 20 vocabulary words that you found challenging, along with their definitions from [www.learnersdictionary.com](http://www.learnersdictionary.com)
- II. Create a chart in which you record important information about the main character from each chapter of the novel.
- III. Respond to five (5) journal entries. Each journal entry should be at least three paragraphs long. Please copy down the prompt before responding. They do not need to be typed, but should be written legibly if handwritten! Please write on loose-leaf paper that can be collected.
  1. Explore how the main character changed (especially in thinking or feeling about or toward someone/something) throughout the story. Make sure to write about the character before the change, what happened to cause the change, and the character after the change?
  2. Write a diary entry in the voice of a character in your book.
  3. Write about something that happened in the story that surprised you or that you found interesting.
  4. Did you like the ending of the book? How would you have liked it to end? Rewrite a new ending for the book.
  5. How have you changed your way of thinking/feeling about anything after reading this book? Explain.

We will use these answers to do a novel project in September. Please have it completed upon return to school!
