RE: Summer Reading for next year's students of Combo Grade 10 American Studies-Literature:

We are very excited that you will be joining Combo Grade 10 American Studies Literature next fall. This summer, you are assigned to read Washington Irving's "Rip Van Winkle" published in 1819. The full text can be found here: https://tinyurl.com/49avc272

Rip Van Winkle is a short story set in colonial New York. It is about a kind, but lazy man, who falls asleep in the mountains and wakes 20 years later to find his village transformed by the American Revolution.

ASSIGNMENT

Objective: Explore how Irving's story reflects America's transformation after the Revolution by comparing Rip's village before and after his 20-year sleep.

Task: Create a"Then vs. Now" Infographic with images and text, highlighting:

- Government (British rule vs. democracy)
- Social Life (quiet village vs. busy, opinionated townspeople)
- Symbols (portrait of King George vs. George Washington)

Requirements:

- Include at least 3 direct quotes from Rip Van Winkle that show Rip's confusion or observations.
- Be creative! Add humor, Rip's old-fashioned language, or dramatic reactions.

How does Irving use humor to show the Revolution's impact on ordinary people?
