Summer Assignments 2019 – Checklist

The following is required of you over the Summer Holidays (hah) between IB Years 1 and 2. You will be graded on each upon return in September 2019, and your preparations will affect your Predictions.

- 1. Historical Investigation (SL/HL):
  - Fully updated drafts of Sections 1 & 2 of your Internal are due upon your return these should be complete to the best of your abilities, and in line with the IB mark schemes (approx. 500 / 1,300 words per section, respectively)
  - For any last-minute queries, re-read pages 84-92 of the IB History Guide, and view the samples I have posted for you on Moodle
  - ➢ No excuses
    - 20 marks each Section x 2 = 40 marks

### 2. <u>Standard and Higher Level:</u>

- **Textbook:** Access to History: The Cold War and the Americas (1945-1981) (<u>1<sup>st</sup> edition</u> / 2<sup>nd</sup> edition)
- Note: BOTH SL and HL students are required to do the following readings from an admittedly HL textbook 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition is the newer hard copy, and has much better analysis for HL students.
  - $\checkmark$  Read and takes notes on:
    - SL/HL Chapter 6: pages 93-124 <u>OR</u> 93-124 (Vietnam)
      - *HL ONLY* pages 124-128 <u>OR</u> 124-135 (Canadian & L. American reactions to the Vietnam War; Edition 2 is far better for this)
    - SL/HL Chapter 7: pages 132-152 <u>OR</u> 139-157 (The Cuban Revolution)
    - 40 marks each chapter x 2 = 80 marks

## 3. <u>Higher Level ONLY:</u>

- Textbook: Access to History: Civil Rights and Social Movements in the Americas, post-1945 (2016 edition lime color)
  - ✓ Read and takes notes on:
    - **Chapter 1**: pages **1-52** (Native Americans and civil rights in the Americas)
    - Chapter 2: pages 53-89 (African Americans and the Civil Rights Movement)

- Chapter 5: pages 155-176 (Youth culture and protests of the 1960s and 1970s)
- **Chapter 6:** page **177-219** (Feminist movements in the Americas)
- ✓ These cover:
  - Background,
  - Indigenous peoples,
  - (Intro to African Americans and the Civil Rights Movement),
  - Youth culture and protests, and
  - Feminist movements
    - Four chapters x 25 marks each = 100 marks

# Total marks available: 120 (SL) / 220 (HL) marks

Note: you may cover the remaining chapters for Civil Rights (Chapter 3 & part of Chapter 4) if you wish to have a basis for the Civil Rights portion of Paper 1 we will be covering when we return in September.
